Professor Spuyten, a noted eccentric, doesn't like to use the ++ operator because he says reminds him of eyes looking at him. He has written the following program:

```
int main(void)
{
  int foo = 52;

  increment(foo);
  /* foo should be 53 by now. */
  printf("The value of foo is now %d.\n", foo);
}

void increment(int n)
{
  n += 1;
  return;
}
```

He explains: "Since I don't like the increment operator, I wanted to write a function to do the same thing. I thought that if I did increment(foo), the value of foo would get bumped up to 53. But it didn't work."

- 1. What does Professor Spuyten's program print out, and why doesn't it print 53?
 - 2. Correct Professor Spuyten's program so that it does what he wanted.
 - 3. There are at least three other errors in Spuyten's program. Find them.
